Group Study Exchange

Lynn Ayers introduced her fellow traveler, Cherice Daniels, to provide a summary of their Group Study Exchange (GSE) visit to Madhya Pradesh, in the heart of India. Lynn led the group of four non-Rotarian team members from sponsoring Rotary Clubs: Cherice Daniels (Plymouth), Chelsea Matson (Minneapolis University), Jessie McClurg and Megan Waterman (Minneapolis City of Lakes).

The purpose of the GSE program is to promote international understanding and goodwill through personal connections. For four weeks, team members experience the way of life, customs, and vocational practices of another country, while sharing information about their home country. Their blog:

Lynn and Cherice provided a whirlwind, but brief photo recollection. It seemed the experiences could be summed up with a single word - **INTENSE!** Every moment was chaperoned and scheduled, leaving the team filled with experiences, but worn out by the pressure to be attentive and respectful of their hosts efforts and public appearances. Staying in 8 different homes, featured in 7 newspaper articles, and eating 5 meals a day were some of the impressive numbers. Lynn recalled, "Cultural Immersion" was a task that sounded like treading water without a life jacket or ladder to get out of the pool. Vocational visits brought familiarity and focused Lynn on small-plot farming, and Cherice on micro-financing. Notable memories included sightseeing at temples, getting the custom fitted saris, meeting the leader of India's Parliament on the side of a road, receiving flower leis by the bushel, spontaneous speeches to small groups of 200 people, and celebrating the success of Rotary's Polio Plus campaign on their last day in India.

Lynn-thank you for representing the best of Chaska as only you could do - "Namaste" and "Shukriya" from all of us.



"He told me to cut the legs off the bed! Ain't nobody under there now!"




